RAMC. Captain. Campbell College. QUB MB 1916. Hospital ship Assaye. Born 02/08/1891. Son of Charles and Margaret Davey, Chlorine, Malone Rd., Belfast. Died 01/12/1931

DAVIDSON, Isaac Alexander

RAMC. Captain. MCB. QCB BA, MB 1892, BCh BAO MD 1898. Captain RAMC 08/04/1916. Born 23/01/1869. Son of James Davidson, St Mary's Terr., Crumlin Rd., Belfast. Husband to Alison Knowles. Died 15/05/1942 at Danesfort, Annadale, Belfast

DAVIDSON, Thomas Augustus

RAMC. Captain. Military Hospital, Victoria Barracks. QUB and Edinburgh Univ. Born 1856. Son of John C Davidson, Clifton St., Belfast. Died 28/03/1928 after being knocked down by a tram. Belfast City Cemetery.

+DAVIS, John

RAMC. Attached River Sick Convoy Unit. Private. 84040. Died 22/07/1917. Age 38. Campbell College. Matriculated 26/11/1896. B.A. 1899. He was a Church

of Scotland minister who enrolled in RAMC. Appointed Minister of the Parish of Buittle, Castle Douglas, Kirkcudbrightshire, 1905. Son of the Rev. John Davis, of Ballynahinch Manse, Co. Down; husband of Margaret Davis (nee Kernahan), of "Grasmere," Lansdowne Rd., Belfast. Amara War Cemetery, Mesopotamia.

+DAVIS, John Henry

RAMC. Lieutenant. Died 21/02/1916. Belfast Model School. QCB 1886, MB 1899. BCh BAO. Son of Robert Davis, Duncairn St., Belfast. Died from head and leg injuries after his motorcycle collided with a tram. Belfast City Cemetery.

+DAVISON, Robert

King's Liverpool Regiment, 12th Btn. Second Lieutenant. Died 08/10/1916. Age 20. QUB Medical student. In France from 24/07/1915. Son of Robert (MD) and Lizzie Davison, Romanov, Ormeau Rd., Belfast. Grove Town Cemetery, Somme, France.

DEMPSEY, Sir Alexander

RAMC. Served 1914 - 18. In Egypt from 25/03/1916. Knighted 1911. St Malachy's College, Belfast. QCB MD 1874, the Catholic University Medical School, Dublin and Queen's College, Galway, he earned the degree of Doctor of Medicine of the Royal University and the Diploma of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland in 1874. In 1874 he set up his own medical practice on Donegall Street, Belfast. He was a founder member, secretary and later president of the North of Ireland Branch of the British Medical Association. He was president of the Ulster Medical Association from 1880 to 1891. In 1880 he was named as a magistrate for the City of Belfast. Born 1852. Son of Bernard Dempsey, Coldagh, Ballymoney. Husband to Jane. Died 18/07/1920 at Coldagh, Somerton Rd., Belfast. Milltown Cemetery

DEMPSEY, Alexander Joseph

RAMC. Captain. Clongowes Wood College. QCB 1929. Served 1914 - 18. Captain 17/05/1916. Born 1886c. Post - war, Clinical Lecturer and Examiner in Gynaecology and Midwifery QUB. Son of Sir Alexander Dempsey (above).

DICKEY, Alfred Charles

RAMC. Captain. Campbell College. Queen's University Scholar in Anatomy, 1912. M.B., B.Ch., 1916. Mesopotamia from 27/11/1916. Born 25/09/1893, son

of Rev. CCM Dickey, The Manse, Draperstown, Co. Derry. Post - war Physician and Surgeon. Beeston Road, Leeds, Yorkshire.

DICKEY, Archibald Alexander George

OC and MO Colne Aux. Military Hospital. MBE (1919). Raphoe Royal School. QUB MD 1883. Born 1861. Son of John Porter Dickey, Carnore. Husband to Marion. Died 19/01/1936. Forebridge Parish.

DICKSON, Charles

RAMC. Captain. MC (17/09/1917). QUB MB 1908. Born 1886. Son of John and Mary Dickson, Wellington Pk., Belfast. Husband to Gladys Mary. Died 01/01/1978. St Patrick's C of I, Enniskerry

DIXON, Ernest Stewart

RAMC. Lieutenant. BRA. QUB MB 1913. Served 1914 - 18. Born 1884. Son of Alexander and Harriett Dixon, 'Kincora', Antrim Rd., Belfast.

DODDS, Robert Leslie

RNVR. Surgeon Sub - Lieutenant. Served as Surgeon Probationer. Foundation member of QUB Services Club. Graduated QUB 1920. Born at Dundee in 1898, son of the Rev R W Dodds, a Methodist minister. He was educated at the Methodist College, Belfast. He interrupted his medical studies to join the RNVR, and served with the Grand Fleet at Scapa Floe in HMS Mameluk. He qualified in 1920 and, after being house physician at Swansea General Hospital, came back to Belfast as demonstrator of anatomy. He decided to specialize as an obstetrician, and obtained an appointment as obstetric registrar at Charing Cross Hospital. He took the Fellowship in 1927, and proceeded to the Belfast MCh the same year.

He subsequently joined the staff of the City of London Maternity Hospital, the Samaritan Hospital, the French Hospital, and the Bearsted Memorial Hospital. His real opportunity came with the reorganization of the London County Council's maternity services in 1934, in which he played a leading part; he continued to serve the Council as obstetric consultant at St James's Hospital, and was also obstetric consultant to the Ilford and Edmonton borough councils. During the second world war he served as surgeon to troopships 1943-44, with the rank of major RAMC, but had to resign his commission from ill-health. He died in the Middlesex Hospital on 26/01/1949, aged 50, survived by his widow. He was an expert in his own specialty, and an excellent lecturer and administrator. He was also of great courage, and

activated by humanitarian motives. Happening to be a universal blood donor, he was always ready to offer his blood for transfusion in emergencies.

DOWSE. William St Leger

RAMC. Lieutenant. QUB MB 1914. In France from 08/10/1914. Served later as Surgeon RN. Born 1891. Son of Francis and Jane Duffin, Deramore Pk., Belfast.

DUKE, John Herbert

RNVR. Surgeon Sub - Lieutenant . Served as Surgeon Probationer. Surgeon Sub - Lieutenant 05/04/1918. RBAI. QUB MB 1921. Foundation member of QUB Services Club. Served in the destroyer HMS Vendetta, stationed at Scapa Floe and served in the North Sea with the Grand Fleet. He qualified at QUB 1921 and subsequently held appointments as Consulting Physician in Geriatric Medicine at St. Andrew's Hospital, Bow, London. St Columba's Parish Church, Knock WM.

DUNCAN, Alexander

RAMC. Captain. Moneymore Intermediate School. QCB 1888. Served 1914 - 18. Gallipoli. Born 1869. Son of William and Eliza Duncan, Killyfaddy, Magherafelt. Husband to Elizabeth. Died 30/09/1933, Waveney Rd., Ballymena

DUNLOP, Charles William Julius

Ophthalmic surgeon. QUB 1880. Served 1914 - 18. Born 1864, Ballylesson. Son of Charles and Ellen Dunlop. Husband to Rosa. Died 21/11/1945, Hornsea, Middx

DUNN, John Hubert

RNVR. Surgeon Probationer. MiD, OBE (1945), TD. RBAI. QUB medical student. Entered the navy late 1917. Served in the destroyer HMS Triton, stationed at Scapa Floe, through part of 1918. He was promoted to Surg. Sub. Lieutenant RNVR., with seniority from 16/10/18. Graduated QUB, BCh, DPH, BAO, QUB 1920. MD 1924. FRSM. After graduation and holding the offices of house physician at the Belfast Infirmary and Greenwich Hospital, he became RMO to the National Heart Hospital. Between the wars he became a well-known physician in London. In

the second war he served with the RAMC with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and for a time was Medical Adviser to the Malta Command. He was Mentioned in Despatches, awarded the TD in 1940 and made OBE in 1945. Born 20/11/1897. Son of William and Jeanne Dunn. Husband to Margaret Craig nee Eaton, daughter of Colonel Robert Young Eaton and Margaret Craig Eaton, Toronto. She gained the rank of Colonel Director-General in the service of the Canadian Women's Army Corps. She was invested as an Officer, Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1945. Born 20/11/1897. Son of William and Jeanne Dunn. Died 20/02/1978, Bramley, Guildford. Holywood. High St - PCI RH.

Post war he ultimately was Consulting Surgeon Tyrone County Hospital, Omagh. Born 1900. Son of Joseph and Ellen Eaton, Altnagelvin, Londonderry. Husband to Winifred. Died 01/04/1956 Co. Tyrone. Waterside - PCI RH

ELLIOTT, Charles Roulston

RAMC. Colonel. Royal School Raphoe. QCB MD 1884. Captain Feb. 1887, Lt Colonel Nov 1911, Colonel March 1915. Son of Andrew and Sarah Roulston, Drummurphy, Co. Donegal. Husband to Mary. Died 30/10/1936, Dhu Varren, Portrush

EMERSON, Edward Crawford Trench

RAMC. Captain. Campbell College. QUB MB 1914. BCh BAO MD 1927, DPM 1926. Prior to the war he was Lecturer and Demonstrator of Anatomy in QUB. Lieutenant, July 1914. Captain May 1915. From 05/12/1916 in France, 2nd North Midland F Ambl. Attached to Durham Light Infantry as MO. Was admitted to hospital in France with trench fever. (Belfast News Letter 20/08/1917). Born

24/02/1889. Son of Edward Emerson JP, Enderley, Knock. Died December 1974, Portsmouth

EMERSON, Herbert

RAMC. Major. MC. QUB MB, BCh. Lieut RAMC, Major OTC. In France from 01/10/1915. Born 1888. Son of Hannah Emerson, Market Square, Tandragee.

ENTRICAN, James

RAMC. Lt Colonel. Portora RS. QUB MD 1887. Surgeon Captain IMS July 1891, Major July 1903, Lt Colonel February 1912. Served 1914 - 18. Civil surgeon Burmah 16/11/1917. Husband to Amy. Married in Rangoon. Died 14/03/1935 Hove, Sussex

MO 9th RDF and later Connaught Rangers. Born 1886, Neillsbrook, Randalstown. Son of Rev James and Mrs Rachel Ferguson, Neillsbrook. Ronssoy Communal Cemetery, Somme

President RCSI 1926 - 29. Born 1868 Cavan. Sin of rev Alexander and Mrs My Fullerton, Methodist Church. Husband to Caroline. Died 23/05/1934. RCSI RH

RAMC. Major. MC and Bar. QUB MB 1914. BCh BAO MD 1930. Lieutenant RAMC Feb 1912. MO i/c Surgical Div Staty. Hosptal. MC 01/01/1917, Bar 18/02/1918. Born 1891. Son of Elizabeth Fulerton, Gortinegin, Gortgranagh, Co Tyrone.

GAFFIKIN, Philip Jacob

RAMC. Colonel. MC. MiD. QUB MB 1911. BCh, MD 1914. DPH 1916. Lieutenant Sept 1914. Gallipoli from July 1915. Born 1888. Son of Mary Elizabeth Gaffikin, University Rd, Belfast

GALLAGHER, John Frederick

RAMC. Captain. QUB and Edinburgh Univ. MB 1905. Lieutenant 1916, Captain Jan 1917. Served in France.

+GASTON, James

RAMC. Captain. MC. Died 05/11/1918. Age 36. Ballymena Academy, Queen's College, Belfast; and the Royal University of Ireland - where he graduated M.B., B.S.R.U.I. in 1906. He had been in practice at Cloughmills, Co. Antrim, and when war broke out he was engaged in an extensive practice in Durham. He gained a temporary commission in the RAMC at the rank of lieutenant on 28/12/1914 and was promoted to temporary Captain one year later. James entered the war in France on 19/05/1915. After serving with a West Riding Field Ambulance he was attached as Medical Officer to the 5th Bn. King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. He was wounded in September 1916, then after recovering returned to France in January 1917, and was attached as Medical Officer to the 4th Bn. Suffolk Regiment. He was awarded the Military Cross "For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He attended the wounded of five other units besides his own throughout the day. The next day he led a party out in front and recovered twelve more wounded who were lying out. Throughout he set a splendid example to all." James was the eldest son of Andrew and Marian Gaston of Carabeg, Cloughmills. "His brother, Captain Andrew Gaston, RAMC, is also a holder of the Military Cross and a younger brother, Dr. John Gaston is practising in Chester." Ballymena Observer, November 15, 1918. GAUSSEN, Cecil Lovette

RAMC. Captain. QUB. MB BCR 1912. "Captain Cecil L. Gaussen, R.A.M.C, who is officially reported seriously ill with fever at Bombay, is a son of the late Mr. W. L. Gaussen, Holywood, and nephew of Dr. D. P. Gaussen, Dunmurry. He graduated at Queen's University Belfast, in 1912, and has been fifteen months in the East, chiefly as surgeon on an hospital ship in the Persian Gulf. The latest wire from the War Office states that Captain Gaussen is progressing satisfactorily. His brother, Private Charles L. Gaussen, South Antrim Volunteers, was killed in action on 1st July, and another brother is Mr. Wm. Gaussen, Bangor". Lisburn Standard 20/10/1916. Born 1890. Son of Julia Emma Gaussen.

RNVR. Surgeon Sub - Lieutenant (19/09/1918). Served as Surgeon Probationer. QUB MB BCh 1921. Son of Julia Emma Gaussen, Demesne Rd., Holywood, Co. Down.

+GAVIN, Noel John Hay

RAMC. Captain. MC and Bar. Died 02/11/1917. Attached 14 Btn RIRifles. MC 04/07/1917. Bar 18/10/1917. "Attached as M.O. to the 14th Battalion Irish Rifles, died in France on Nov. 1st, 1917, as the result of an accident while riding up to the trenches at night along a wooded road. His horse took fright, bolted, slipped and fell, throwing Captain Gavin on his head, and inflicting such serious injuries that he died shortly after reaching the casualty clearing station. He was buried the following day in the local cemetery. For services in the field he had been awarded a M.C. and bar." (In Memoriam, 1914-1918, Wanganui Collegiate School). QUB/Edinburgh Univ 1904. PMO Hospital ship Sicilia, France, Gallipoli, Egypt and Iraq. Born 1855. Son of Assist. Surgeon Hart Desmond Gimlette, RN. Died 07/03/1930, Swansea.

+GLASS, George Shaw

RAMC. Captain. RBAI. QUB. Graduated in medicine 1911. Lieutenant RAMC Nov 1914. Captain April 1915. The Northern Whig reported that whilst serving on attachment with the Hampshire Regiment, he was seriously ill in a Cairo hospital, his regiment having seen service in India and the Near East.

HOLMES, James McAlister

RN. Staff Surgeon. DSO. MiD. Methodist College, Belfast 1895 - 1897. QCB MB BCh BAO 1903. F.R.C.S.Ed. 1920. Held an appointment at Belfast Royal Infirmary for a year before entering the navy. Served for three and a half years on HMS Sandpiper on the China station and in HMS Achilles and HMS Castor in the war. Awarded DSO (16/09/1916) for his services during the Battle of Jutland, "For the very efficient way the wounded were attended to whilst under fire and

subsequently.” DSO was invested at sea by the King in June 1917. He was also Mentioned in Despatches. Promoted Surgeon Commander 1919. Three articles in Naval Medical Magazine. Retired in rank of Surgeon Captain in 1930. Marlborough Park, Belfast. Born 28/02/1880, Islandmagee. Son of John and Isobel Holmes, Annavale, Islandmagee and a great grandson of Rev William Holmes who fought for the King in the 1798 Rebellion. Husband to Alice Poole of Dunedin, New Zealand. General practice Llandovery, South Wales. Retired to South Yelverton, Devon. Elmwood - PCI RH. Second Islandmagee - PCI RH. Methodist College Belfast RH

HOLMES, John Victor

RAMC. Major. QUB MB 1913. BCh, DPH 11920. Gallipoli from 06/08/1915. Born 1889. Son of John and Isobel Holmes, Brookvale Ave., Antrim Rd., Belfast

HOUSTON, Sir Thomas

RAMC. Major. OBE. MiD twice. Pro - Chancellor QUB. Coleraine AI. QUB BA, MB 1895. BCh BSc MD 1899/ OBE 01/01/1919. Knighted 1927. President of the Ulster Medical Society. Lecturer in Medical Jurisprudence, QUB. He was the pioneer of blood transfusion in Northern Ireland and was also responsible for the early development of the whole discipline of clinical pathology (particularly haematology and microbiology). Sir Thomas had gained considerable experience of treating casualties in the First World War with blood transfusion and he established a voluntary Blood Transfusion Service at the Royal Victoria Hospital, Belfast, later to be called the Belfast Blood Transfusion Service. Blood was provided by a small panel of a few hundred voluntary donors, mainly organised through the police. In those days all aspects of blood transfusion, including administration to patients, were carried out by Dr Houston and his team in the laboratory. In 1948 the staff of the RVH presented Sir Thomas with a portrait of himself painted by Frank McKelvey RHA. The Ulster Medical Journal of 01/11/1948 contains a professional tribute to Sir Thomas' contribution to medicine in Northern Ireland and beyond. Born 1869. Son of James Dick and Anne Houston, Coleraine.

HOUSTON, Thomas Hugh

RAMC. Major. Campbell College. QUB MB 1912. Born 1885. Son of William and Elizabeth Houston, The Nuir, Killagan, Co. Antrim

HOWE, John Hutchinson Garner

RNVR Surgeon. Cowley College, London. QCB 1888. Born c 1861, Holywood, Co. Down. Son of William J Howe, Ballytrin, Killyleagh. Died 26/12/1929

JACKSON, Culbertson

RAMC AND RIR. Lieutenant. MC. Born in 1893. After BRA, he was studying for a science degree at QUB when the war started. He enlisted as a private in the RAMC, being posted to France in October 1915. He received a commission in the 11th (South Antrim) Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles, on 16/07/1916. He was wounded in the left shoulder and thigh in April 1918 and was awarded the Military Cross in September 1918. Post - war, he followed his father and paternal grandfather (whose entire ministry was spent at Sligo Presbyterian Church 1855-1887) into the ministry of the Presbyterian Church. He held the charge at Sligo from 1922 - 1926, when he resigned to accept a call from Randalstown Presbyterian Church. He was installed in Crescent Presbyterian Church, Belfast, on 30/10/1930 and remained there until he retired on 31/01/1962. His son, William Moffatt Jackson, also entered the ordained ministry. Born 1894. Son of Rev WJ and Mrs Eliza Jackson, Crescent Lower, Belfast, formerly of Duncairn Manse, Belfast. Died 05/10/1977.

JACKSON, John Luke

RAMC. Captain. Campbell College. QCB 1904. MB 1910. Captain RAMC Aug 1915. Son of Herbert Jackson. Died 05/04/1937

JACKSON, Thomas

IMS. Lt Colonel. QUB 1886. QCC MB1890. Lieutenant IMS 1892, Surgeon Captain 1895, Surgeon Major 1904, Surgeon Lt Colonel 1912. Served Sudan 1896, Dongola Campaign, NWF and Tirah 1897 - 98, 1914 - 18. Born 1865. Son of Hugh Jackson, Mulnagore, Co. Tyrone. Died 16/10/1919 at Milburn, Australia.

JAMISON, Robert

Imperial Light Horse, Medical Branch. Captain. OBE. RBAI. QUB MB 1906. MRCS 1910, FRCS 1910. Went to Swaziland as Asst MO in charge of Hilatikulu District. Volunteered to serve with Imperial Light Horse. Recalled to civilian administration I/c hospital and police work. Born 1880. Son of Sir Patrick Jamison, Ballyrush, Ballygowan. Died 15/07/1945 after severe attack of rheumatic fever.

JEFFERSON, Frederick

RAMC. Major. BRA. QUB MB 1913, BCh. Served from 20/08/1914. Born 1888. Son of Wm J Jefferson, Rose Lea House, Cliftonville.

JOHNSTON, Henry Mulrea

RAMC. Lieutenant. Upper Sullivan School. QUB BA 1901 MB BCh BAO 1903, FRCS, MRCS 1911. Served 1914 - 18 Queen's Hospital, Sidcup. Professor of Surgery RCSI 1912 - 26. B1877 Holywood. Son of David (MD) and Clara Jefferson. Died 08/10/1926. Mount Jerome Cemetery, Dublin

JOHNSTON, Joseph Greenfield

RAMC. Captain. MC. QUB. MB 1908. BS MD 1913. In France from 08/10/1915. Born 1884 Newtownards. Son of Alexander Johnston. Husband to Norah

JOHNSTON, Robert

RNVR. Surgeon Sub Lieutenant. QUB student. Served as Surgeon probationer. Surgeon Sub Lieutenant Aug 1918. Served in armed yacht HMS Campanula. QUB MB 1922.

JOHNSTON, Robert Alexander

RAMC. Captain. QCB. RCSI. LLM 1900, RCPI, RCSI. Born 1868. Son of Francis Johnston, Ballykinlar. Husband to Nellie. Died 27/08/1960

JOHNSTON, Thomas James William Abram

SAMC - South African Medical Corps. Captain. MC. Marconi School, Dublin. QCB MB 1895. BCh BAO BS. Born 1871 Sligo. Son of Dr James (Surgeon) and Mrs Jane Johnston. Died c1943

JOHNSTON, William Thomas

Brigade Surgeon. Londonderry Acad Inst. QCB 1868, MD 1875, LRCS Edin 1876. Surgeon Aug 1897, Surg Major Aug 1899, Brig Surg July 1900. Served Egypt 1882, 1914 - 18. Born 1853. Son of John Johnston, Beragh. Husband to Eileen. Died 07/02/1942, Patrick St., Strabane

JOHNSTONE, Sir Robert James

Surgeon UVF Hospital. KB, 1938. RBAI. QUB where he was a scholar in 1891, 1892, and 1894, Dunville student in 1895, and Coulter exhibitor and first medallist at the BA examination. MRCS and FRCS December 1900; BA RUI 1895; MB BCh 1896; FRCOG 1929MRCS 1900, FRCS BA 1895, FRCOG 1935. Enlisted in the Uni Vol Force during war and was engaged in its duties as a volunteer worker without a commission. He served as house surgeon at the Royal Victoria Hospital as soon as he was qualified, was demonstrator of anatomy at Queen's College, and was appointed to a studentship in pathology under Professor Lorraine Smith in 1896. He then took postgraduate courses in London and Vienna, and on his return, having determined to devote himself to the diseases of women, acted as assistant to Sir John Byers from 1900. He was soon appointed surgeon to the Belfast Maternity Hospital, and in 1902 was elected assistant gynaecologist at the Royal Victoria Hospital, becoming surgeon in 1908 and professor of gynaecology at the University in succession to Sir John Byers in 1921. When the Parliament of Northern Ireland was established in 1921 Johnstone was chosen to represent Queen's University in the Ulster House of Commons. He did much good work in this position, and took an active part as a member of the Royal Commission which issued a report upon which the Education Act in Northern Ireland was afterwards based. MP for QUB 1921 - 38. He did equally good work at the British Medical Association which he joined in 1897. For seven years he was secretary of the Ulster branch, of which he was president in 1921, and in 1937 he was elected president of the Association when the annual meeting was held in Belfast. During his year of office he received the honour of knighthood. From 1927 until his death he represented Queen's University on the General Medical Council, and from 1934 he was a member of the Dental Board. He took a prominent part in the inception of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, was a foundation Fellow, and was elected to the Council. In freemasonry he was always interested, was one of the founders and was the first master of the Queen's University Lodge. He was for two successive years captain of the Royal County Down. Golf Club. Born in 1872 at Greenisland, Co Antrim, where his family had lived for many generations. Only son and eldest child of Charles Johnstone, land owner, and Mary nee McCreavy. Husband to Florence, daughter of the Rev G Magill, Presbyterian minister of Cliftonville. She survived him. He died at Newcastle, Co Down on 25/10/1938.
